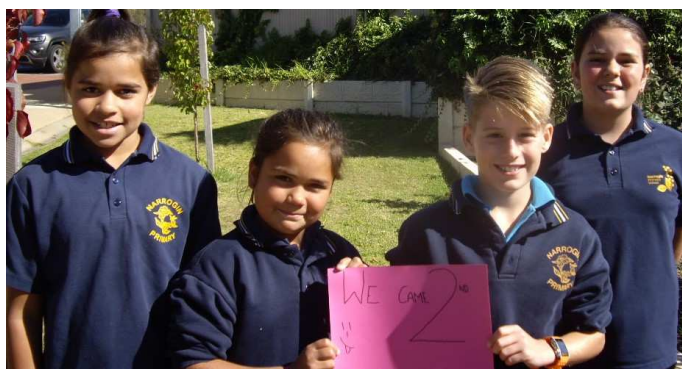


5 F PERSUASIVE WRITING COMPETITION
