HEAD LICE

Head lice can affect ANY person with hair, as they tend to cling to the strands of individuals. They are small, fast moving, and can be extremely difficult to spot. Head lice are particularly common among groups of children who play in close proximity to each other, but can spread to any person with sufficient hair to provide a home to the lice.

How to find and treat Head Lice

- Comb the affected person's hair thoroughly with conditioner. This stuns the lice, making them lose their grip on the hair strands.
- Wipe the comb clean on a tissue or paper towel.
- Check the tissue for eggs or lice.
- Repeat these steps four or five times, combing the entire head.
- If you find lice or eggs, treat the person for head lice.

Treatment can be done with chemical insecticides that have been specifically formulated for head lice. If you choose not to use insecticides, then the method described above for finding head lice can be used to treat them, combing through conditioner every two days until there have been no new eggs or lice found for 10 days.
