State Budget 2014-2015

The Government has just released the State Budget 2014-15 including the budget for the Department of Education. Details are on the <u>Government's website</u>.

You will see that the State Government will spend \$4.58 billion on primary and secondary school education in 2014-15, an increase of \$187.7 million or 4.3% on 2013-14. While there is a requirement to maintain teacher numbers in 2013-14, the Budget provides for an additional 550 teachers in 2015.

The Department of Treasury has provided a Budget infographic depicting the public education budget for 2014-15 which is on our website.

ROAD SAFETY - KEEP YOUR KIDS SAFE IN TRAFFIC

What can you do to help keep your children safer while out walking? Here are a couple of tips.

Hold your child's hand

Explain why it is important for children up to 10 years of age to hold an adult's hand when walking near traffic and while crossing the road. Point out that adults are more familiar with the road rules and can also decide when a situation is dangerous.

Teach your chid how to cross the road

- 1.STOP at least one step back from the kerb or edge of the road
- 2.**LOOK** in all directions for approaching traffic (left, right, front and back)
- 3. LISTEN in all directions for sounds of approaching traffic
- 4. THINK before deciding it is safe to cross
